CANADIAN INTERNATIONAL TRADE TRIBUNAL INITIATES INQUIRY

ALUMINUM EXTRUSIONS FROM CHINA

Ottawa, Ontario, August 19, 2008—On August 19, 2008, the Canadian International Trade Tribunal initiated a preliminary injury inquiry into a complaint by Almag Aluminum Inc. of Brampton, Ontario, Apel Extrusions Limited of Calgary, Alberta, Can Art Aluminum Extrusion Inc. of Brampton, Ontario, Metra Aluminum Inc. of Laval, Quebec, Signature Aluminum Canada Inc. (formerly Bon L Canada Inc.) of Richmond Hill, Ontario, Spectra Aluminum Products Ltd. of Bradford, Ontario and Spectra Anodizing Inc. of Woodbridge, Ontario, that they have suffered injury as result of dumped and subsidized imports of aluminum extrusions from the People's Republic of China. The Tribunal's inquiry is conducted pursuant to the *Special Import Measures Act* as a result of the initiation of a dumping and subsidizing investigation by the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA).

On October 17, 2008, the Tribunal will determine whether there is a reasonable indication that the alleged dumping and subsidizing have injured the domestic industry. If so, the CBSA will continue its investigation and, by November 14, 2008, will issue a preliminary determination. If this preliminary determination indicates that there has been dumping or subsidizing, the CBSA will then continue its investigation and, concurrently, the Tribunal will initiate a final injury inquiry. Anti-dumping and/or countervailing duties will be imposed only if the Tribunal finds that dumped or subsidized products are injuring or threatening to injure the Canadian producers.

The Tribunal is an independent quasi-judicial body that reports to Parliament through the Minister of Finance. It hears cases on dumped and subsidized imports, safeguard complaints, complaints about federal government procurement and appeals of customs and excise tax rulings. When requested by the federal government, the Tribunal also provides advice on other economic, trade and tariff matters.
